## CROSS-CULTURAL AWARENESS WORKSHOPS

The interactive workshops are designed to provide a cross-cultural experience in an open and non-threatening environment. Our workshops are especially valuable for those who work closely with Indigenous people, in urban contexts or remote communities across Australia.

- **Australia's history and its impact on Indigenous communities**
- **Indigenous Worldview, Kinship and Law**
- **Communication and protocols when working with Indigenous people**

## AIMS OF THE WORKSHOPS

Develop a deeper appreciation of Australia's Indigenous heritage, languages, cultures and worldview.

Reflect on how Australia's history and policies on Indigenous affairs continue to impact the life of Indigenous communities.

Explore how cultural assumptions and prejudice affect intercultural relations and identify attitudes and practices which assist communication.

Recognise the importance of understanding cultural expectations and protocols when working alongside Indigenous people.
